Three local contestants up for Master Mechanic challenge

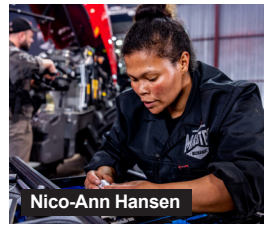


Caleb Webster
